PCOC Roundtable Discussion for USNA Parent Club Websites

Hosted by Steve Clark Hall - USNA '75, Regional Trustee for AA Board of Trustees and Karen Hurst - Tampa Bay Naval Academy Parent Club

The purpose of this roundtable discussion was to present a plan to the parent club officers to offer a uniform and convenient platform for website hosting, design and development, and to solicit feedback from the clubs.

Of the 84 parent clubs, we found that less than half of our clubs had an internet presence, and of the current websites, some were very detailed and others were very simple. Many were outdated (technologically speaking) most likely due to a former webmaster no longer being active in the club. We felt that ease of transition and maintenance moving forward was a key factor in initiating this new format along with the support of each of the clubs to each other and the Alumni Association & Foundation.

Here is a breakdown of the current platforms for the 38 parent clubs with websites / internet presence:

46 parent clubs indicated no website or internet presence.

Our objective is to provide a platform, structure and template so that all clubs could create a website in less time with fewer resources.

To implement this, the Alumni Association will handle domain registrations - as each club will be a subdomain of <u>usnaparents.net</u> and the hosting will be provided to for each. This will save each club the money that they would spend on domain registration and hosting each year.

The process will involve notifying the USNAAA site admins via an established website for the parent clubs that a site is requested. Once notified, the subdomain will be secured (for example localclubname.usnaparents.net) and the WordPress platform will be set up for the club.

This new platform will provide consistency across the websites, but will also allow for customization to theme and choice of plugins.

A template will be provided via download to each new club that registers and the club can then make specific modifications and additions according to their needs and objectives.

The initial template is to be modeled after the current <u>usna.com</u> website.

The template will include links to the USNA and Alumni Association and Foundation websites. It will allow for pertinent information and links regarding local Alumni Chapters and Blue and Gold Officers.

The template will also allow links to social media accounts such as facebook groups and pages.

Search Engine Optimization will also be included.

Event Registration will continue through the Alumni Association.

The initial rollout plan for the new website structure is to select a few pilot clubs for first test sites and then make it available to all of the parent clubs.

The elements of the template are being fine tuned and then the rollout will begin.

Please note, if a club wants to keep their current website, that is OK! We are targeting new club websites and those that want to update their design and/or improve maintenance and control.

 - · Choose File from link on admin website
 - Upload
 - Select admin for Author
- · Go to Appearance Themes
- Activate Theme
- Then Customize It:
 - Site Identity Club Name / Tagline
 - Header Image
 - Menus Choose Menu Locations
 - Widgets (Side Bar Content)
 - Static Front Page = Welcome
 - Posts = News, Event & More
