# REPORT SUMMARY

The report estimates that we will have ~\$3M capital costs over the next 30 years (in current dollars). The inflated value is near \$9M. Examples:


- We will need to replace carpet every 7 years @ \$118K in today's dollars.
- In year 14, in addition to the carpet, we should anticipate \$445K for the overhaul of our HVAC system

### STEM AND NASS SCHOLARSHIP COORDINATION OPPORTUNITY

- Scholarship opportunities allowed chapters to help out local students attend NASS & STEM
- Process much improved this year with Nancy on staff and Admissions staff codifying and simplifying the process for chapters AND NAMA
- Final for 2024 was 21 chapters, 4 NAPC and 2 SIGs donating with over \$70K donated for NASS and STEM Scholarships (Chapters contributed \$20K in 2023 ~50% increase year over 2022 being supported by 17 chapters)
- NAMA SIG contributed >\$30K all by themselves in (more than 45 students)
- NESA Significant contribution in late Q4

### Process

- 1-31 July Call for Nominees
- 1-14 August USNAA Staff conducts background checks and categorized A,B,C
- 15 August 1st Meeting.
  - Each member drew a number from a hat for a group of ~6 Nominees to present
  - Members worked in pairs to read each other's packages so each nomination was read by at least 2 committee members
- The Committee agreed to notify individually those nominees in their group that were not selected once the Board approved the selections.
- Scheduled 4 meetings before Final Vote.
- Scoring Rubrics were given for both VLS and AOA-P Awards.

Bill Squires '75 – New Jersey chapter Cystic Fibrosis Foundation (CFF) since 2002 and Board of Directors since 2013, serving as its president since 2022. Blue and Gold Officer since 1991. Currently the Area Coordinator for northern New Jersey.
Nathan Schmidt '02 – Aids survivors of the Ukraine war via the Mountain Seed Foundation (MSF), which he founded in 2021 supporting the families of fallen Ukraine soldiers.
Stephen Leaman '69 – Leads the USNAAA Alumni Mentoring Program. Habitat for Humanity action officer and philanthropic donor 1984 to present.

### ALUMNI OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT – PROFESSIONAL

#### Winner:

Matthew Wallace '84 – Director for Planetary Science at the NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory Conceptualized, developed, implemented, and executed the highly-successful Mars Perseverance Rover mission as its Project Manager. The Perseverance mission included the ground-breaking and highly successful Ingenuity Mars Helicopter and Mars soil sample collection processes.

### Honorable Mentions:

William Edward Cummins '69 – The only only other Naval Academy graduate who had more impact on the nuclear industry was Admiral Hyman Rickover. Led a large team of Westinghouse nuclear engineers for over two decades that imagined, defined, detailed and licensed revolutionary nuclear safety technology for a new generation of commercial nuclear power plant.

### ALUMNI OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT – PROFESSIONAL

### **Honorable Mentions (cont):**

**Nelson Jones III '72** – on 29 July 2024 won a \$1.96 billion judgement on behalf of the families and survivors of the USS Cole. Said Mr. Jones, "One way to stop terrorism is to take the terrorists' money and give it to the victims!"

**Victor D'Andrea '84** – on 4 June 2024 his company TechSource stood out over hundreds of companies and received the Department of Energy Small Business of the Year award. Victor has taken TechSource from a small 5-person start up specializing in nuclear physics and engineering to become one of the preeminent science and engineering consultancies for the National Nuclear Security Administration.
