


THE GOUGE



These events take place at Arlington National Cemetery and more than 3,400 other locations across all 50 U.S. states, as well as at sea and abroad. During the ceremony, remembrance wreaths will be placed on their graves, and each veteran's name will be spoken aloud.

Class of 2024 Obtain Career Assignments

Approximately 1,049 midshipmen from the <u>Class of 2025 received</u> <u>their service assignments at USNA</u>. Midshipmen choose from 22 Navy and Marine Corps career options, submitting preferences in August of their senior year. Assignments are based on Department of the Navy requirements and midshipmen's aptitude and preferences. This year, 75% received their first choice, and 18% their second. The class includes 787 Navy and 262 Marine Corps assignments.

Army-Navy Uniform Tribute

<u>NAAA and Under Armour have revealed the 2024 Army-Navy game</u> <u>uniform</u>, a tribute to the legendary Jolly Rogers. The 125th edition of this iconic rivalry, presented by USAA, will take place on 14 December at Northwest Stadium in Landover, MD. The Jolly Rogers were established in 1943 and are the most lethal and history-rich squadron in all of naval aviation and continue to exemplify the traditions and excellence of professionalism of the U.S. Navy. Their tagline is *Fear the Bones* and their callsign is *Victory*. Flying over nine different types of fighter aircraft in the past 63 years, the skull and crossbones have become the most recognized and feared insignia in the world.
